Mechanics vs. Substance From the Lay Director Frank Jakob M57

"Do not worry about your life and what you will eat, or about your body and what you will wear. For life is more than food and the body, more than clothing. Notice the ravens ... Notice the flowers ... If even the smallest things are beyond your control, why are you anxious about the rest?" (Luke 12:22 ff.)

Cum Christo has an obligation to see to both the mechanics of our operations, as well as the continuing substance of the movement. Having prayed about our mechanics, the Lord has blessed us with volunteers for the Cum Christo Operations Group (COG), see the January 2001 Quiri at www.CumChristo.org.

The substance of the movement has to do with the purpose, mission, and method of Cum Christo.

- The purpose is to become leaven in the world, changing the world for Christ, one person at a time.
- The mission is to energize, then enable lay Christian men and women to effectively penetrate their environments with faith in Jesus Christ.
- The method for persevering in this mission and achieving the purpose is group reunion and "Ultreya!" (The Spanish word for onward.)

When we promote the movement, it is only so that when you approach a candidate there may be an awareness about your invitation ... so that there is credibility and authority

behind your invitation (that of the Church) ... so that you can point to the thousands of others who experienced Cum Christo and the millions of those around the world who have entered their Fourth Day.

In the end, however, the invitation to attend a weekend is a personal one: one between you and your friend, between sponsor and candidate. Choose your candidates, the Lord's leaders, wisely, then sponsor them aggressively. Bless couples with the gift of being sponsored together, early enough so as to be scheduled to make sequential weekends (Spring or Fall). Ultreya!

Sponsor/Candidate Communications and Application Processing Sandy Goggins W113

Have you ever wondered what happens to those weekend applications once they are submitted? One of the segments of the new COG team (Cum Christo Operations Group) is application processing. We are still in transition and are working on fine-tuning the system. However, our goal is to provide prompt handling of applications and timely communication with candidates and sponsors.

The entire process of receiving an application and posting it to the weekend candidate list is accomplished in three phases:

- 1) Mail is picked up at the Cum Christo post office box weekly (more frequently

just prior to a weekend) and forwarded to application processing.

2) Applications are reviewed for complete information, and correspondence with candidates and sponsors are generated.

3) The web servant is notified of current candidate lists for posting on the website.

The expectation is for each candidate and sponsor to receive an acknowledgement letter within 10 days of receipt of an application. The candidate and sponsor will then receive a more detailed letter 2-3 weeks prior to the weekend. If there is a cancellation, candidates and sponsors will receive acknowledgement within 10 days, with options for attending

future weekends. Any carry-over applications will be added to the next available weekend with letters going to both candidate and sponsor 3 to 4 months prior to the weekend.

Let's all continue to nurture the growth of Christ in our communities by providing weekend opportunities to potential candidates. Christ is counting on you!

SPONSORS: Please remember your commitment to "Pre" and "Post" Cum Christo weekend clean up. Cleaning begins at 7:00 PM the Monday before and the Monday following the weekend. If you are unable to help, find someone to take your place. Many hands make short work.

KITCHEN AND FOOD: Please call Terri Turner W101 (740) 964-0850 (H) to volunteer either as a day steward or to help prepare a meal. Fridays are particularly hard to staff. If you are neither a sponsor, nor the spouse (or family) of a team member or candidate participating in the Weekend, sacrifice the time: call and offer your help. Also call Terri if you are planning to donate any food for the Weekend. As always, your help is **welcomed and NEEDED**.

PALANCA: The essence of Palanca is a message of sacrifice. Write extra Palanca notes addressed "Dear Babe Chick" for candidates you do not know. Palanca from strangers is powerful stuff. GENERAL Palanca is introduced on Friday afternoon; deliver it as early as possible Friday morning. PERSONAL Palanca from sponsors, spouse/family, and guardian angels is introduced on Saturday afternoon; deliver it by mid-morning Saturday and write your relationship to the candidate on the envelope. Palanca from the community is distributed Saturday evening; deliver it no later than mid-day Saturday so it can be sorted and evenly distributed. Palanca in the form of gifts is distributed late Sunday afternoon before the Closing.

SERENADE: Sunday - Will begin promptly at 6:00 AM. Please do not bring children. For those interested, breakfast at TeeJay's on Dublin Road immediately following the Serenade.

CLOSING

The Closing will be Sunday, April 29, 2001, 7:00 PM, at All Saints Lutheran Church in Worthington, 6770 N. High Street (A half mile south of Rt. 270).
