### A Brother in Christ

Yesterday we were informed that a brother in Christ, Don Weeks, died suddenly from a heart attack. He was a faithful group member for several years before he and his family moved away. One of our group members recalled how he called Don one evening about 5 P. M. at work and asked what he was doing? Don replied “that he was doing paper work and would be there until 9 or 10”. The group member said, “Okay I’ll talk to you later”. Don asked, “What did you want?” The group member said, “Nothing important. I just need you to save my spiritual life.” Don said, “I’ll meet you in 15 minutes at a local bar.” Don and the group member talked for more two hours and then they left. Don returned to his office and worked until after midnight. He understood the meaning of group and loyalty and the need to minister to a brother in need.



The three day week-end is held to transform people so they become aware that they are an agent of change. This happens in a threefold development. A: They transform their mentality. B: They conform their life to Christ, and C: They transform the structure of life.

### Music Update

God has a plan for you. He wants you to give away your talent. And the musicians who are actively involved want to welcome your talent.

Romans 12:5 says, “Since we find ourselves fashioned into all these excellently formed and marvelously functioning parts in Christ’s body, let’s just go ahead and be what we were made to be.”

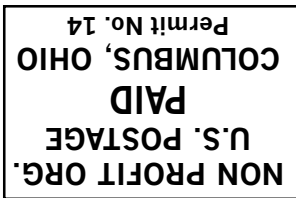
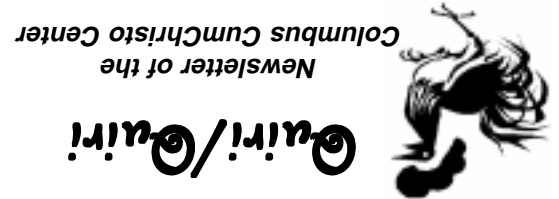
