A Message From the Lay Director

Stacey Bergmann, our wonderful editor, tells me I need to contribute a "teaching" article this edition. I say "nah"! What can I teach? What do I know well enough to teach? I could explain structure within our movement and how things function, but I suspect most of you know the basics if not all the specifics. Lay director may sound like a fancy title, but I am discovering I know less about the nuts and bolts of our movement than many, and I find my main job besides being guardian of our web site is to come early to meetings and start the coffee.

There is a need to talk about money in our movement, but I loathe it so I asked my wife to do that job, and she graciously agreed. She is an expert on the subject.

There are more than enough very good articles in this edition that discuss good sponsorship of candidates and functions of different sections of the movement like weekend, music, pre and post Cum Christo or Leaders School.

It seems to me I would be more effective as a teacher if I could tell a story, so please indulge me.

About 15 to 20 years ago our parishes were commissioned to start programs of spiritual renewal within our own parishes. Somehow I was invited to an opening session where we discussed how to proceed. As I was driving to that meeting I considered what it was that had made Cursillo or Cum Christo so much a part of my life. It came surprisingly easy to my mind, so that I was able to contribute at that meeting and this is what I said: Start a program and call it whatever! Renew, Emmaus, Cursillo, Christ Renews His Parish; no matter what the name it needs to have these three main characteristics:

2. The program is structured to involve ever expanding circles of people – circles that are inclusive and not exclusive.
3. The program must be fun!

Does this sound familiar? I hope so. If not we are not doing a complete job.

Have you ever wondered how the Rectors are chosen and how they then “learn” how to use that huge blue notebook that becomes a much thinner red book for the actual weekend?

This is the time of year that all of this begins to happen and here are the answers to these questions.

The discernment of Rectors is done two years ahead of the actual weekend they will be serving as Rector. This is a fairly new decision as an answer to a problem we have had for years. Getting Spiritual Directors has always been a challenge and after input from our Spiritual Directors it was decided that we need to choose Rectors very early so that they in turn could contact Spiritual Directors at least a year or more ahead of their weekend. At this point in time it has been somewhat more helpful but continues to be a challenge.

This past July the Lay Director (Joe Di Cesare), a Spiritual Director (Father Cotton), Pre-Cum Christo (Jerry Abraham), Leaders School (Elaine Beem), Post Cum Christo (Jenny Held), and the Weekend Representative (Judy Gibeaut) met to discern the Rectors for 2007. This happens after several weeks of mighty prayer over the eligible names. We will then meet and pray, vote, pray, vote etc. until we agree as to whom God is calling to be His co-worker in leading His Cum Christo weekends.

To be eligible one must not have been a Rector in the past 6 years. God has allowed us to want new/fresh leaders. One must have served on a minimum of 2-3 weekends, not including Guardian Angel roles, and preferably served as an Assistant Rector. Leading a weekend with God really calls for experience in the “process” of the weekend as well as leadership skills. You who have participated in the Weekend Orientation really understand what this means.

Then comes Rector School. This is held in August or early September for



The Gift of Sponsorship

When we were called to our Cum Christo weekend, God did so through another Cursillista who had previously made a weekend. We accepted this calling or gift just as we accept His ever-flowing grace. This

gift of the weekend, the method and this great movement of people has been with us ever since. Many of us have accepted this gift and used it for the Glory of God. Others have felt a responsibility to share this gift with others. When we share this gift with others, we do so in a very structured way through a process of sponsoring candidates.

Sponsoring candidates for Cum Christo is made up of three very important elements. They can be defined as Pre-Cum Christo, the Weekend and Post-Cum Christo.

Pre-Cum Christo includes the selection of an appropriate candidate, explaining the weekend, grouping and Ultreya to the candidate, cleaning the center and delivering your candidate to the center on Thursday evening. All of this is preceded by a growing, Christ-centered relationship and prayer for this potential Cursillista.

The Weekend activities are centered on providing support for the candidate and their family during the weekend. This includes palanca (prayer and sacrifice) for the benefit of your candidate. It also should include a visit to Serenade the candidates, and attending the closing.

Post-Cum Christo sponsorship responsibilities are of utmost importance. Beginning with a ride home from the closing, they include cleaning the center for the second Monday in a row, attending Ultreya for three weeks, helping your candidate find a group and providing support for their first year as a babe chick. Your relationship, in Christ, can grow immensely now that you share a common method and understanding of your Christian faith.

So, have you freely accepted this gift of the weekend, the method and the movement? Do you feel a sense of responsibility to share this gift with other Christian leaders? If so, continue to pray that God will reveal those who are ready for Cum Christo. And when you are called, respond with a gift of your own by accepting the responsibilities of sponsorship.

- For ongoing formation of Christian Community, so that piety, study, and action can be fostered and encouraged.
- To provide an atmosphere of unity, which the diocesan, parish and Christian communities must have if they are to be dynamic and radiate their fervor and zeal.

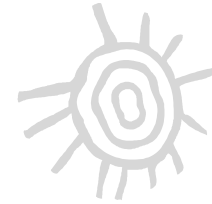
Ultreyas are held at the Holy Cross CumChristo Center every Wednesday evening at 7:30pm.

How can I get involved and support the Columbus Cum Christo's Ultreya?

There are two ways you and/or your group can support Ultreya. First is to join a monthly Ultreya Team. Some groups have made this an annual group event. To join a team, sign your name and telephone number to the Ultreya Team poster usually found in the kitchen after Ultreya's. The second opportunity is for you to join the Permanent Ultreya Team. The Permanent Ultreya Team, nicknamed "P-U-T" is a two-year commitment. The first year you will be asked to participate in several events with an experienced mentor. The second year you will have the opportunity to lead a monthly Ultreya team or other event supporting the community. If you are interested in joining PUT, you will be asked to attend Cum Christo leaders training called "Weekend Orientation." This is a short study of the inner-workings of a Cum Christo weekend and the movement. Typically Weekend Orientation is offered twice yearly at the Cum Christo Center.

Whether you participate on a monthly Ultreya Team or on the Permanent Ultreya Team, other members of the community walking with Christ will support and encourage you. The experience will deepen your faith and help you see the miracles Christ has in store for all who believe in Him."

Cum Christo Weekend Talks on the Sacraments

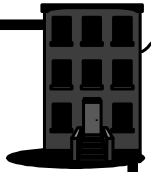

The talks on the Sacraments are the second and third talks on Saturday, the second day of the weekend. The talks of this day are explanations of how the Life of Grace is done. Each talk tells the candidate what to and how to do it. At the end of each talk the candidate must be able to say that they know something they should be doing, which they may have not been doing before. They now may have some idea about how to do it. On the second day the focus is primarily individual and personal. The talks and examples should focus on the individual Christian and their relation to the person of Christ and other individuals.

The Sacraments are to be presented as encounters with Jesus in the Church, which make possible the fullness of the Christian life. The sacraments, rather than things received, are expressive actions of Christ. They consecrate the Christians for union with God, and create communion between them. The emphasis is on Jesus' saving action through the sacraments, rather than a complete catechesis on sacraments or an introduction to sacramental theology. The candidates should be helped to see how they could experience the saving action of Jesus through the Sacraments today. The spiritual director should present his/her own witness of how he/she experienced the power and presence of Christ in a particular celebration of the sacrament. The seven Roman Catholic sacraments are to be covered. The sacramental gifts of other churches are to be presented so that the candidates can see the sameness, similarity and differences in approaches to the sacraments. Catholic and Protestant spiritual directors should work closely to present the sacraments in a pastoral way. The spiritual directors should study the make-up of the community of candidates for the particular weekend so that they can make appropriate references in their talks, keeping in mind that certain churches may call sacraments by different names or terms. These two talks should be overflowing with various examples of the "working" of the sacraments as celebrated by the spiritual directors. The candidates should be led to make notes on how they can revisit the sacramental celebrations of their churches, seeking fuller communion with the Lord and their fellow parishioners.

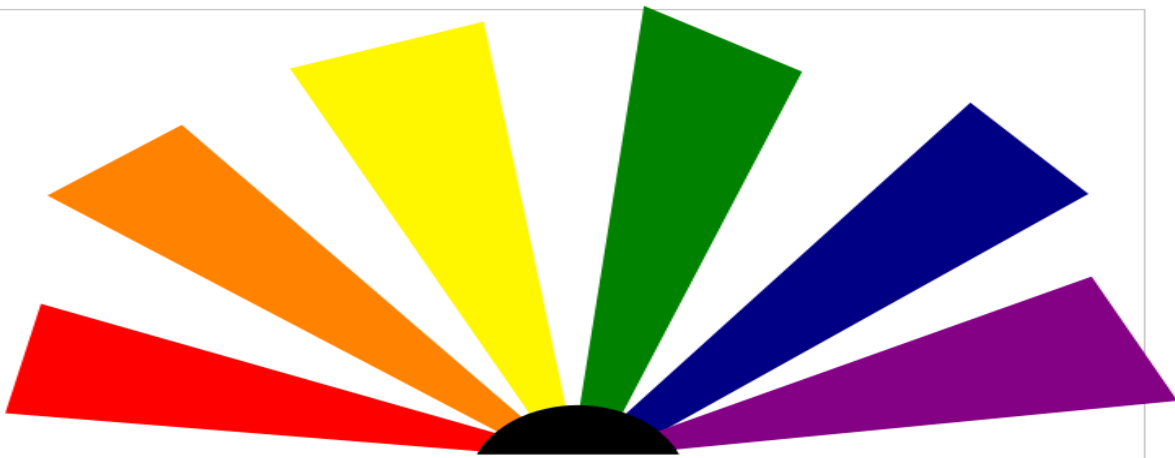

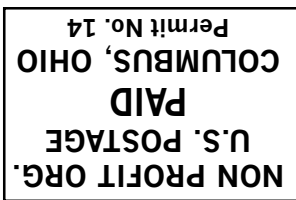

Palanca is a Spanish word. It means "lever". A lever allows a person to move something beyond his/her capabilities. In the Cum Christo/Cursillo sense, *Palanca* is prayer and sacrifice on the part of one person, offered to God so that others may accomplish more than they would be capable of otherwise.

The essence of *Palanca* is *sacrifice*. Greeting cards, banners, computer generated spiffy graphics, candy, food, gifts and the like are not *Palanca*. Those things may carry the message of *Palanca*. In and of themselves, the vehicle is not *Palanca*. The message, a message of prayer and sacrifice, is *Palanca*.

You are invited to do *Palanca* and to share that *Palanca* with the Cum Christo community. You may do this by sending it to be read for an *Utreya*, or you can write *Palanca* for a team, each team member, or the candidates of a weekend.
