From the Lay Directors

Dear Cum Christo Brothers and Sisters,

By the time this Quiri reaches you, summer will be about over and the Men's Weekend will be upon us. We are praying that this Weekend will not be cancelled because we don't have enough candidates. Which brings us to the question for this Quiri: How do you decide whether to cancel a weekend or go ahead with it? Are there guidelines or is it up to the Lay Directors to make the decision? Section 5.4 of the Cum Christo Movement's Guidelines states:

"The number of candidates who are approved for a weekend will be limited to twenty-eight (28). If there are not twenty (20) firm candidates two weeks before the starting date of the weekend, the weekend may be canceled by the Lay Director."

Keeping in mind that these are *guidelines*, the Lay Directors may ultimately make the decision to accept a later deadline or even accept a lesser number of candidates. However, too few candidates impede the table dynamics, which is really where the Weekend happens. Trust that Team Beem will make the decision based on much prayer if the number of candidates.

On another note: in the Catholic Church this is "The Year of the Priest." We hope that you will join us in praying for our priests, and for all of our clergy and sisters who faithfully serve Jesus both in Cum Christo and in our parishes and churches by giving of themselves tirelessly. Much of their service is hidden, and unrecognized.

We are grateful for their courage and faithfulness to their vocation, and we thank them for answering God's call. May they continue to inspire us and witness living a life in Christ by the manner in which they quietly present Christ's words and actions to us every day.

A recent retreat that Cliff and I attended at St. Meinrad Archabbey, entitled “Praying the Bible”, led me to reflect on why we in Cum Christo practice Bible Enthronement. We enthrone the Bible on our Three Day Weekends, the Leaders School-sponsored Weekend Orientation, Rectors School, and at each Ultreya. In solemn procession we carry the Bible into the Rollo Room, flanked by lighted candles and accompanied by singing.

I believe that Sacred Scripture mirrors God and becomes for us a reflection of God.

In Deuteronomy 6:4 we read “Hear, O Israel! The Lord is our God, the Lord alone!” – (the *Shema*). The prophet Jeremiah says “Listen to the word of the Lord, O house of Jacob”, and also “When your words came, I ate them”. By consuming the Word of God, it feeds us; it becomes a part of us. What a wonderful thing, to be so enamored of the Word that we consume it – live, eat, and breathe it. Through the prayerful reading of Sacred Scripture, we are called to open the eyes and ears of our minds and hearts to conversion. This is the living Word of God – Christ is present here with us through Scripture. It has been said that ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of Christ.

Community reading of Scripture results in a community experience of faith. To live the message of Scripture is to also be drawn into Christian community. And this community experience can be enhanced by our private prayerful study of the Bible.

Bible Enthronement is a way for our Cum Christo community to honor the Word of God, and at the same time to strengthen our ties with one-another as we continue to grow as a faith-filled community.

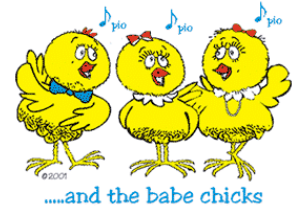

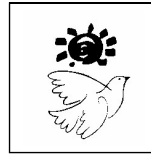

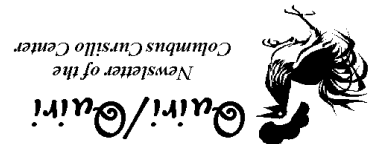
