Pre Cum Christo

In Cum Christo we hear a lot about discernment. The leaders and members of the many parts of our movement are discerned such as Secretariat, Leaders School, Pre and Post Cum Christo, and all of the other sections. Rectors for our weekends are discerned and they, in turn, discern their Assistant Rectors and their teams. Sponsors discern whom the Holy Spirit is directing them to sponsor. Discernment pervades the entire Cum Christo Movement. BUT, what is discernment?

Spiritual discernment in Cum Christo is the process by which one discovers God's will. The process enables you to distinguish between what is coming from God and impulses that are not from God. In discernment through prayer and petition we call on the Holy Spirit to lead us and to give direction. Then we must suppress our own will and desires and listen to Him. It is how the Spirit shows the church and its people what God wants them to do and to be. Discernment without prayer, petition and listening is useless.

Cum Christo is God's movement. It does not belong to the Lay Directors or anyone in Secretariat, Leaders School, or the other sections of the movement. The Lay Directors and members of these sections are servants of the movement. In the same way, the Rector of a team is not and must not consider himself/herself the owner of that team. It is not their team, it is God's team. The rector and assistant rector of a team are servants to that team as the team members are servants to the candidates that God calls to a particular weekend. Cum Christo will surely fail as many other movements have failed if we forget that Cum Christo is God's movement and we MUST discern His will, His direction, for us through prayer and petition.

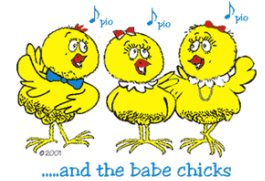

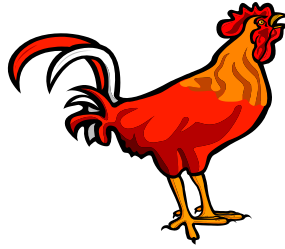
