## **Ordinary Time?**

In early January I emailed Trish Barber requesting the due dates for the Quiri article to be written by the Spiritual Director. She emailed me the dates, and so I decided to write the article that was due January 30. Then I sent the other dates to the other Spiritual Directors and asked them to choose dates for the rest of the year.

I finally sat down on Friday, January 16, and wrote the article and emailed it to Trish; at least I thought I emailed it to Trish. Friday the 16<sup>th</sup> was busy since I was going away to warm weather on the 19<sup>th</sup> for a week. You know how it is, try and get everything done and clear off the desk before you leave, because who knows, you might not come back. I thought I got that done, so I moved onto 10 other things. But to my surprise, on returning to the office on the 27<sup>th</sup> there was a note from Trish asking me which Spiritual Director was going to write an article for the 30<sup>th</sup>? You could imagine what I thought and most likely what I was thinking and saying. After looking through out my computer system, my secretary said "it's not there to be found, what did you do?" I said, "I thought I sent it on the 16<sup>th</sup>."So here I am on Tuesday January 27<sup>TH</sup>, at 2:08 p.m. trying to write something for the Quiri. I'm going to stay with my original thought of "Ordinary Time."

Time comes and goes, so often before we know it. It seems like we just finished Advent and lighting of each Advent candle in anticipation of Jesus coming in our ordinary time of our world. That led us to decorate our churches and homes with trees, lights and flowers. We were busy shopping to catch the best sales at the stores. Then there were those wonderful smells of the fresh baked goodies. And then there was placing of the crèche -- the nativity set -- up under the tree or in its special place in our homes or churches. Over the next couple of Sundays, most churches celebrated the feast of the Holy Family, the Baptism of the Lord, and the Epiphany. These weeks are referred to as Advent and Christmas Times. The Sundays after the Epiphany and up to Lent, and then those after Pentecost and up to Advent of next November '09 are referred to as "Ordinary Time."

Why "Ordinary Time?" Are there no special times in the life of the church or us, as God's children? Are there no celebrations of our Christian faith and witness for the Lord? Does the Lord take a back seat the rest of the year for you and maybe your family? During the "ordinary" days, do we every pass the threshold of a church and share with other Christians our life and hopes or our needs and concerns?

I thought I had something completed and done well until that note on my desk on the 27<sup>th</sup>. It was "Ordinary Time." I thought I had done or written a decent article but maybe that was the problem, "I had done." I forgot one important person in writing something and that was my God. His time and my time are two different times. That's when I came to realize that it is not me but He who guides and directs and strengthen me. It is He who was sitting with me in my office and saying, calm down, it will get done. And you know what, I'm doing it and it is just fine because He is with me in a peaceful heart.

So often our lives are, or just seem to be, "ordinary times," but they usually are not. We can get so caught up in things, life, business, family actives or meetings and forget to take the time to relax and smell the flowers. Our day begins as extra-ordinary by simply waking up and putting our feet on the floor and beginning a new day. Who knows what the Lord has in store for you that day? Who knows how we might change someone's life or our own by a simple hello, or a smile or a kind act for somebody or giving of a listening ear or sharing how we might have over come some difficulty? I don't believe life is ever just "Ordinary Time." Jesus is not "ordinary," He is "extra-ordinary." He is my Lord and Savior. He is my joy and happiness. He is the one who accepted the cross and gave new life and hope to all. He is grace, my grace and life today, tomorrow and to the end of time. As He is all of this for me, He is also that for you. Don't be "ordinary" but "extra-ordinary" with the Lord and He with you.


